And the answer.... None of the above. The bunny was actually a beloved fertility icon used by pagans long before Christ was born.


When I was growing up, I never questioned Mom's tales of the Easter Bunny, even though some were kind of strange. I learned that if I played along with her stories of fluffy pink rabbits and neon eggs, I was sure to get a basket loaded with chocolates and peanut butter cups. Worth it!!!

Some of Mom's traditions actually pointed to Christ... One was a hollow sugar egg, with a peep hole onto a miniature world. Inside that sugary egg were tiny flowers, houses, smiling children, and of course, rabbits. Actually, that miniature garden is a metaphor for the message of Easter. Imagine a new world, in which resurrection has already occurred. Imagine a place of perfect peace and joy.

But before imagining such a perfect world... First, we need to imagine Jesus' journey to Calvary... That's just what the Gospel of Mark does. After vivid descriptions of Good Friday's terror... After gut wrenching images of the gore of the cross... Mark paints glorious images of the empty tomb and of hope reborn.

Mark tells how Jesus' friends arrived to anoint his body, only to discover that the stone had been rolled away. Fearing the worst, they peered in and were startled to encounter – not a dead body, but a man who tries to calm their fears, "Do not be alarmed – he isn't here – he has been raised – go tell Peter that Jesus is going ahead of you to Galilee." That's where their homes are. That's where their families are waiting... That's where their memories are filled with comforting images of work and play and together time. No wonder the risen Lord promises to meet them where memories are rich and where they need him the most! The miracle of Easter is simply this: In the dark of the night, when we think all is lost... Christ comes to us, breathing new life and hope and love - whenever and wherever we may happen to be. And though we might be overwhelmed or awestruck or even thunderstruck... We are not to be afraid. The love that he offers overcomes whatever obstacle stands to bar the way. Nothing... Not even DEATH can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

## Meet Beher Ghosheh Ph.D ~ Wed April 10th @ 12 noon

If If you think that immigration challenges are limited to southwestern United States, Dr. Beher Ghosheh has a worldwide perspective on this subject. This is not a political talk, but rather an examination of a worldwide phenomena.

Dr. Baher Ghosheh holds a Ph.D. in Economic Development from SUNY-Buffalo and has been a Professor of Middle Eastern Studies, cultural and economic Geography at Edinboro University since 1989.

A native of Jerusalem, Dr. Ghosheh has lived in eight countries, traveled to fifty-nine countries, and has taught in Japan, China, Russia, Italy, and Morocco.

He has authored one book, book chapters or Russia and the Middle East and 60+ articles on the Middle East, Asia, and Japan.

He was awarded a Fulbright to conduct research in Malaysia and Singapore and was selected as the Pennsylvania Geographer of the Year and Edinboro University & Educator of the Year. He serves on the JES board of trustees.

Church was on their lips and in their hearts.






#### Milton's Work




The Meaning of Jesus





